

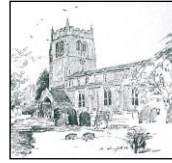

Dear Friends,

I'm sure that time is speeding up. It feels like only yesterday that I was sitting in my study wondering what the New Year would hold. Now we're over 25% of the way through 2022 and Easter is upon us. Before we know it, it will be Christmas again and then we'll be heading into 2023.

Time marches on and the world keeps spinning which can sometimes be a bit disorientating. That's why I find Easter such a comforting time. Even though the world can feel like it is always in a constant state of flux, on Easter weekend, Christians celebrate and mark a single moment in time. Christians believe that during one weekend a little under 2,000 years ago something monumental happened.

On Good Friday we remember Jesus' long agonising death on the cross. It may sound a bit morbid to dwell on that, but with our TV screens and newspapers full of horrific stories from not very far away, you can't help but feel like the world is a dark and a broken place. Jesus' death shows us that the world is not always a very nice place. It also offers us the reminder that whilst our world can be bleak, Jesus has lived in it and knows what it is like. Christians believe that on the cross Jesus faced down the darkness that covers this world.

In contrast to the darkness of Good Friday, Easter Sunday offers unbridled joy. The despair of Good Friday is replaced with the joy that comes from knowing how the story ends. In Jesus' resurrection we see the light at the end of the tunnel, the hope that things will be made right again. The darkness and the gloom were only temporary and the future before us is bright and sunny.

During Easter weekend we remember that we live in a world of darkness and light, but the important thing about Easter is that the light wins in the end.

By coming back to life Jesus defeated death. We might be living in a world that seems pretty dark, but Easter Sunday offers us a foretaste of what is to come. Easter promises that the time of light is coming and that the darkness will not be able to overcome.

I don't know how you are feeling this Easter, it could be that you are in a place where things feel light and happy. It could be that there are things going on in your life that make you now feel like a particularly dark time. Whatever you are thinking and feeling at the moment there is something in the Easter story for you right here and now. I'm always excited to explore this with people, but Holy Week feels like a particularly apt time to offer to do so.

We've got lots of different services and activities planned for Holy Week and you are very welcome to join us whether you want to celebrate or mourn.
