Going forwards we will not be delivering the Messenger to everyone in Willoughby, Leamington Hastings, Flecknoe and Grandborough.



A NOTE FROM THE VICAR

How was January for you? There is an expectation that we head into the new year with all kinds of hopes and dreams, full of new year's resolutions and plans to get fit and healthy. But by the time we get to February many of us find that they have often already fallen by the wayside, that's if we were ever there in the first place.

Many people went into January facing things that meant it wasn't ever going to be the hope filled panacea that the Peloton advert told us that it could be. Some people have been thrown a horrible curveball at the start of the new year. What are we meant to do with that? Maybe now is the time to remember the Christmas story.

The good news of the Christmas story is not that Jesus was born in a lovely stable to lovely parents and went on to lead a lovely life filled with nothing but joy and happiness. That's not how it went down. The good news of the Christmas story is that God knows that sometimes life sucks. Jesus was born out of wedlock, a long way from home and spent the early part of his life on the run from a despotic King. It was not a nice life. As Paul puts it in his letter to the Philippians:

I do however know that when life sucks and we tell God that it sucks we're preaching to the choir. God knows. When we are at the end of our tether and we can't take any more we can cry out to God and know that we are not crying out to some remote disinterested God who could change everything with a click of his fingers, if only he could be bothered. We are calling out to a God who 'gets it' because he has 'been there'.

However 2024 has been for you so far, I think we can all take enormous encouragement in the fact that when things are good and we are laughing, God laughs with us. By the same token when things are not so good and we are crying, God cries with us.
