St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians.

Thinking of the recent Royal wedding as well as weddings taken and taking place in our various Benefice Churches at present, it seemed appropriate to reflect on St Paul's letter to the Corinthians in which he stated: "There are three things that last forever: faith, hope and love, but the greatest of these is love."

In the old versions of the New Testament, love is called Charity. However, the word "charity" has become tarnished in view of allegation concerning "Oxfam," Care Homes where care is turned into abuse of the vulnerable, and situations where the wealthy treat their workers with contempt, and sometimes like slaves. Nowadays charity implies just the giving of money - but as St Paul says "I may give all I possess to the needy...but if I have no love, I gain nothing by it." The word "love", in common use, can be abused too. Such love is often exploited and is a tawdry image of the real thing, giving rise to such things as the "Me Too" campaign.

The love that St. Paul means is the care and understanding we should give, not to just our loved ones, but to whoever we come across. It is the attention to all the needs of those we meet every day and sometimes to those we will never meet (when we just "put money in the box") - real selfless love. "Love is patient and kind. Love envies no-one...and keeps no score of wrongs."

This is the basis of our Christian faith. Faith in God is a prerequisite. Hope keeps us moving forward - a special gift from God to combat the challenges of life - keeping us running the race until we reach the finishing line. Without Faith we cannot know the God of Love; without Hope we wouldn't endure. But without Love there can be no redemption. Christ died for us - an act of sacrificial love. So" Love" is the virtue upon which "faith and hope" stand.

For all newlyweds and the rest of us, never go to sleep on a quarrel, treat each other as you'd like to be treated, and hang on to that Love.
